Front Nine

IT'S A FACT — New Zealand may be known for its extreme sports, yet golf is the nation's most popular pastime, and the country boasts more courses per capita than any other. Among the many world-class courses on both the North and South Islands, these nine stand at the fore. ►

Kauri Cliffs Golf Club — With 15 holes overlooking the Pacific — 6 of which are played alongside sea-plunging cliffs — this dynamic, David Harman-designed course has won awards and the appreciation of *GOLF Magazine*, *Golf Digest*, and many others.

Cape Kidnappers Golf Course — Designer Tom Doak said of Cape Kidnappers: "If it were ... any more dramatic, it would probably be cordoned off as a national park." This Hawke's Bay course plays fast, as the stiff winds send plenty of balls plunging deep into the sea.

Wairakei International Golf Course — Set amidst the dazzling scenery of North Island's Lake Taupo region, New Zealand's first internationally recognized golf course remains a classic, rated among the world's top 100 by *Golf Digest*.

Clearwater Golf Course — Home to the HSBC New Zealand PGA Championship, this Christchurch course combines the best of links and parkland play, complete with tranquil lakes, meandering streams, and mesmerizing views of the Southern Alps.

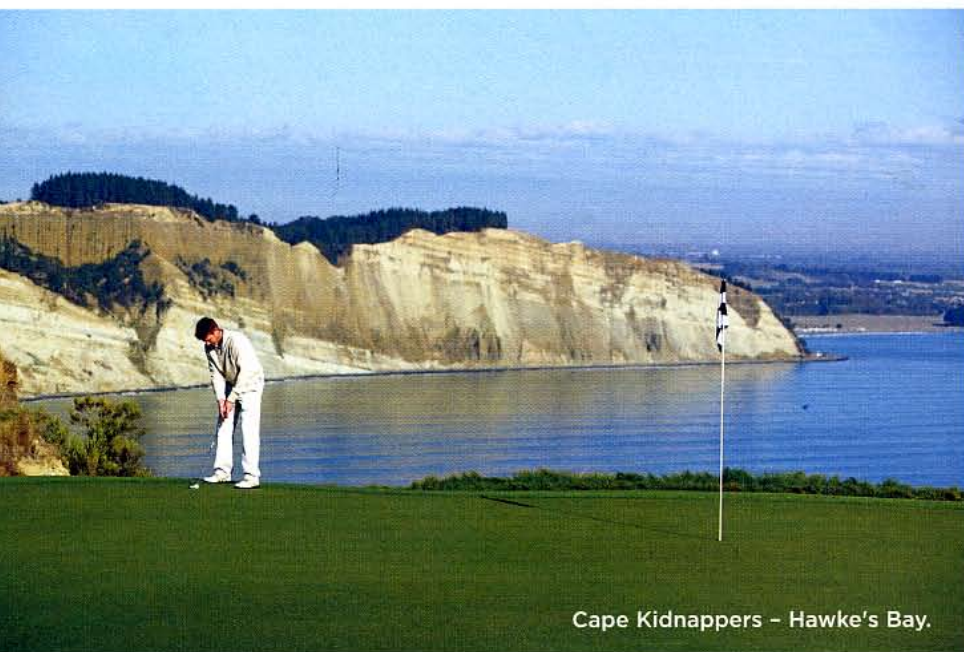
Paraparaumu Beach Golf Club — The most famous links course in New Zealand, Paraparaumu has hosted 12 New Zealand Opens. Even Tiger Woods is tested by the course's rolling fairways and daunting bunkers.

Carrington Golf Course — Situated on the Karikari Peninsula, this course is to Dye for — as in architect Matt Dye, who creatively designed Carrington to play like an inland course, taking advantage of natural contours and water hazards.

Lakes Resort, Pauanui — Set amidst the pristine bush along the Coromandel Peninsula, this beautiful course, which opened in late 2006, proves a formidable challenge for golfers of all levels.

Gulf Harbour Country Club — Offering outstanding views over Hauraki Gulf, this Robert Trent Jones course hosted the 1998 Golf World Cup as well as the New Zealand Open in both 2005 and 2006.

Kinloch Club — The only Jack Nicklaus-designed course in New Zealand, Kinloch is 1 of just 25 courses in the world to be selected by Nicklaus to be part of the legend's prestigious Signature Golf Club.
